A Usability and Cost-Effectiveness Comparison of Popular Test Creation Software

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Introduction

Computer-based testing has become widely accepted in medical education. In fact computer-based testing was introduced to the United States Medical Licensing Exam in 1999, primary out of concern about security of paper administration on a worldwide level. Numerous studies have shown computer-based testing to be efficient, accurate, and enjoyable for examinees. Computer-based assessment provides the ability to incorporate images, multimedia, rapid statistical analysis/scoring, and even adaptive testing. Prior to the development of relatively low-cost, commercially-available test creation software, organizations were required to commission the creation of their exams at significant expense.

The purpose of this study is to evaluate several currently available test creation software programs.

Methods

First, the authors created a list of ideal features for test creation software. Next, an internet search was performed for the purposes of identifying several test creation software programs. The programs identified included: *P.E.S.T.* by Vellosoft Software, *Test Generator II* by Fain and Company, and *Perception for Windows* by QuestionMark Software. The software was obtained and evaluated by the authors for relative ease of use and comparison of features.

Discussion

After extensive review it is apparent that *Perception for Windows* by QuestionMark Software would be the ideal test-creation software for those with minimal computer skills. However, when taking into consideration the high cost of *Perception*, we feel that the P.E.S.T. software represents an excellent overall value. The P.E.S.T. software is the lowest-cost option, but is the most difficult to use, and therefore it may be prudent to train a select group of individuals to author the exams. *Test Generator II* had many desirable features, but again the cost of acquiring is much higher than the P.E.S.T. software.
